RE: Information regarding the New York City Killer; "Son of Sam".

On the above date the undersigned Officer received the following information relative to the above titled subject. Yonkers Police Officer Thomas Brink, shield #148, informed the undersigned that on October 23, 24 or 25, 1974 he was hunting in the Whitney Lake area of the Adirondack Mountains. Brink further stated that during this time he encountered three (3) white males also hunting in this area, armed only with .44 caliber side arms. P.O. Brink stated that, through conversations with the aforementioned, he ascertained that one of the group was named Rodriguez (phonetic), worked for a bank in Manhattan and that the group were expert shots with the large caliber handguns. Brink further stated that he was told by the aforementioned men that they reloaded their own ammunition.

P.O. Brink stated that the aforementioned men, as well as himself, had been flown into the area by the Helms Aero Service, Long Lake, N.Y.

On the above date Capt. William Kamp, C.O. North Patrol Command, came to the offices of this Division and advised Sgt. Kogan of the information contained in the attached report submitted by P.O.'s Verne and R. Cannon.

New York City Police Department, Intelligence Division, Sgt. McCabe, notified of the information contained in the aforementioned report.

After a perusal of the 'Verne-Cannon' report a background investigation of the subject: Richard S. Sperrazza, 1 Remsen Circle, Yonkers.

The following information was ascertained.

Richard Salvatore Sperrazza DOB [REDACTED], current address [REDACTED]. This is a private house (block 4298 lot 33) with the mortgage held by the Community Savings & Loan Association 40 East 1st. Street, Mount Vernon.

The non-published telephone number ([REDACTED]) is listed to Georgetta Sperrazza DOB [REDACTED], the wife of Richard, at [REDACTED]

Address [REDACTED]

The license plate number, listed in the Verne-Cannon report, 546 HDP N.Y., is listed to the aforementioned Georgetta Sperrazza at the [REDACTED] address.

The above information was made available to Det. Richard Salvasen, N.Y.C.P.D. and the following information imparted by Salvasen; it is alleged that the subject, Sperrazza, has a 1974 arrest for a sex crime in the Bronx. Disposition not known at this time. It is further alleged that Sperrazza has a current N.Y.C. 'Hack License'.

that Sperrazza had been interviewed on August 13 and 14th. by N.Y.C.P.D. Inspector Dowd, Sr. Officer of the 109th. Homicide Task Force. Contact was established with Insp. Dowd who stated that it was the opinion of the N.Y.C.P.D. Task Force, and that he concurred, that Richard Sperrazza was not a party to any of the criminal acts committed by David Berkowitz.

On August 15, 1977 the undersigned Officers became aware of a news article, published in the Yonkers Herald Statesman on Sunday, August 14, which could only have been an interview with the aforementioned Richard Sperrazza. Published also, on August 14, 1977, in the Sunday News was an article indicating the presence of David Berkowitz, along with an as yet unidentified white male, at a Mamaroneck animal hospital.



possibility that Berkowitz was a suspect in several crimes here (in Yonkers) as well as a possible suspect in the .44 Caliber killings. Justice was then advised, according to Intervallo, to contact either P.O. Chamberlain or himself.

Berkowitz won't aid in new 'Sam' probe

David Berkowitz, the confessed "Son of Sam" killer, has balked at an attempt by investigators from the Queens District Attorney's Office to question him about the role of possible accomplices in the killings.

Queens Dist. Atty. John Santucci contacted the warden at Attica State Prison, where Berkowitz is serving his sentence, earlier this week and was told that Berkowitz would not consent to an interrogation by Santucci's detectives, Gannett Westchester Newspapers has learned.

Santucci reopened the "Son of Sam" case shortly after a series of investigative articles in the Gannett Westchester Newspapers demonstrated the probability that Berkowitz did not act alone, as he has claimed he did, in the year-long rampage that left six young people dead and seven others wounded in 1976-77.

A spokesman for Santucci would neither confirm nor deny the bid to question Berkowitz, saying, "A pending inquiry is under way in this case and it is not our policy to discuss pending inquiries while in progress."

That inquiry into the two-year-old case is centering on the question of whether Berkowitz was aided by accomplices in the murder spree.

Berkowitz, who readily confessed to all the attacks after his August 1977 arrest, admitted in an interview last year that others could go to jail if he told all that he knew about the case. "And I don't want that to happen," he said.

One prominent aspect of the new probe is the possibility that Berkowitz may have been aided in the killings by members of a Satanic cult that operated near Berkowitz' home in north-west Yonkers during the time the "Son of Sam" killings occurred.

Sources have told Gannett Westchester Newspapers that members of the devil worshipping cult to which Berkowitz is believed to have belonged may have aided him in committing the murders.

Berkowitz' refusal to answer questions from Santucci's investigators is not expected to markedly hinder Santucci's inquiry, which has reportedly spread to several states.

Investigators from the Queens District Attorney's Office were in Yonkers Thursday and, earlier this week, Santucci dispatched two investigators to Minot, N.D., to confer with police officials there who have unearthed information linking the late John Carr with Berkowitz.

Carr was the son of Sam Carr of Yonkers — Berkowitz' neighbor and the so-called "master" Berkowitz said ordered him to kill.

The date is August 4, 1977, the time is 2:25PM. We are in the office of Lt. Martin Hardin, Anti-Crime Squad; present Lt. Hardin, Det. Robert Lorenz and Det. William Grogan, and present also is a white female known at this time as Doreen. Doreen has come to Lt. Hardin and offered some information regarding what may be relative to the person commonly known as the .44 caliber or Son of Sam Killer in New York City.

Interviewer: Doreen, will you start to give us some information. You were in the "Hoops Discotheque" ...

Doreen: Yes, it's correct.

Interviewer: On what date and at what time?

Doreen: June 28 at 11:30 PM ...

Interviewer: That is a Tuesday ...

Doreen: Correct, Tuesday night.

Interviewer: Will you tell us who you were with?

Doreen: I was with my boyfriend and another couple.

Interviewer: Will you tell us to the best of your recollection what you remember from being in that Discotheque at that time?

Doreen: All right, I remember it wasn't crowded because it was during the week and there weren't that many people in it. I went there over the weekend and it's been much crowded. My boyfriend and my girlfriend's boyfriend went to play pool and my girlfriend said there was someone staring at us behind us. I turned around and there was this man, about 3 feet away, who was staring at us and then approached us and said, "Hello. So, huh .., we were talking and huh .., he, and I said to him, "Oh, I'm sorry I didn't catch your name", and he said, "I didn't give it"; and I introduced myself and my girlfriend and he hesitated and told me that his name was Rick ..

Interviewer: Rick? R i c k?

Doreen: Right. So, huh...he was just standing there like, you know, more or less just looking at us, right between us ..

Interviewer: You said looking ... when you said looking, was he looking at you appraising you as a girl ..

Doreen: No, staring at us. So, I started a conversation with him and I asked him if he went to school or if he worked, and he told me that he works downtown and he also told me that this was the first time he ever come up this far to a New York Discotheque, and huh.., he told me that he was in the Pelham Bay area and when I asked him if it was around Morris Park, again he was hesitant and said, "Morris, huh, Pelham Bay". He will not give me any specific information ..

Interviewer: OK, when you were talking to him, obviously you took note of his physical characteristics.

.../...

Doreen: Yes.

Interviewer: Could you describe to me if he is a white male ..

Doreen: Right.

Interviewer: Rather than being Hispanic?

Doreen: Correct.

Interviewer: He is not Hispanic.

Doreen: No.

Interviewer: And he is a white male.

Doreen: Right.

Interviewer: OK, about how tall he is?

Doreen: I say about 5 ft. 8' in. to 5 ft. 9 in.

Interviewer: OK, how do you judge him to be 5 ft. 8 in. or 5 ft. 9 in.?

Doreen: From my boyfriend. My boyfriend is 6 ft. and he stood right next to him.

Interviewer: How tall are you?

Doreen: I am 5 ft. 7 in.

Interviewer: And where did he come to you, when you were talking, you were talking face to face ...

Doreen: I was sitting down at the bar and he came between the two chairs, between my girlfriend and myself. My boyfriend and my girlfriend's boyfriend were playing pool. When the two boys came over he still stayed there; he couldn't get away, looking at us.

Interviewer: Right, about the conversation, let's go through it again from the very beginning.

Doreen: OK, I said to him -- he came over and he said, "Hello" ..

Interviewer: He approached you first ...

Doreen: Yes, well you know how it was, he was standing behind us and I turned around when he started to walk up, so he knew that we turned around to see who he was. He came up and he said to me, "Hello", and I said, "Hello." I said, "Do you come here often?" and he said, "No, this is the first time I'm here" and he said, "Is this always this dead?" meaning there were not many people in there, and I said, "No, during the weekend is much, there is a lot people in there", and he said, "I have never come up this far". I asked him where he was from, and he told me he was from the Pelham Bay area. Then, he asked him where I lived and I said I live in the Bronx, because I didn't want to give where I really live, you know, and he told me he used to live on Corlear Avenue, which is located ...

Interviewer: Say that again-

Doreen: Corlear Avenue is located a few blocks right from my boyfriend's, is more or less considered Riverdale, and then moved to Pelham Bay and he lives alone. He did say he lives alone, and we were talking ... I asked him if he went to school, he said, "No", that he worked downtown and .. huh.., the rest of it I already told you.

Interviewer: OK, eventually apparently from our conversation just a couple of minutes ago, you and your girlfriend kind of ...

Doreen: We thought it might be him from the description in the newspapers, that is why I turned around to look at him because she said, "Doesn't he look like the Son of Sam?", and I turned around and I said, "You know, you're right!"

Interviewer: OK, when you were, during the time the conversation that you were having with this guy, you mentioned to me a couple of minutes ago that you got a quick view ...

Doreen: Definetely, his eyes were just like right through, very watery eyes ..

Interviewer: OK, describe his face, his features, start with the hair.

Doreen: His hair was blond, it wasn't a wig or anything, real hair, blond, true blond.

Interviewer: Dark blond or dirty blond, light?

Doreen: Light, true blond, and he had a mustache which was 4 or 5 inches not a full mustache, no scars, very clean complexion, well build, hair parted on the left hand side ..

Interviewer: What type of hair comb does he have?

Doreen: Parted on the right, no parted on the left and combed over to the right.

Interviewer: You have seen a composite sketch ..

Doreen: That is why I came in, because even my boyfriend said he looks something like him.

Interviewer: OK, now do you agree with the sketch, your recollection was the man in the sketch ..

Doreen: Except for the hair ..

Interviewer: Except for the hair ..

Doreen: Too thick on top, it should be thinner, and his face is like a baby face, in the sketch is too rough.

Interviewer: OK, now after you did say that after a while either your boyfriend or your girlfriend's boyfriend came over to the bar area where you and this man were ..

Doreen: Right.

Interviewer: OK, you want to tell me what happened when your boyfriend came over?

Doreen: Ok, he came over and put his arm around me and this man still wouldn't leave, so he said to my girlfriend and me, "Come on, let's go to the game of pool", so we got up and this man with the blond hair continued in my seat, he did not get out of my seat until we came back. Then the four of us came back, the two boys, myself, and my girlfriend. He got up and stood right next to me even with the two boys standing right behind me. My boyfriend said, "Come on, finish your drink, let's get out of here" This man finished his drink in a hurry, turned around and walked out.

Interviewer: He left previous to you ..

Doreen: About 10 minutes before we left.

Interviewer: And is your belief he must have overheard your boyfriend's remarks to the group that he wanted to go.

Doreen: Definitely, definitely.

Interviewer: And you fear that he positively made an effort to get out of there before you people left.

Doreen: Right.

Interviewer: Now, describe to me as best as you can the clothing that he was wearing.

Doreen: OK, he had a denim dress jeans on and a golf shirt.

Interviewer: What color denim?

Doreen: Solid denim dress, he struck me as not being disco at all, he wasn't into the music or anything.

Interviewer: What color golf shirt?

Doreen: It was white with a blue bird on the left pocket.

Interviewer: Pullover the head jersey type?

Doreen: Yes.

Interviewer: Couple of buttons on the front?

Doreen: No, no buttons at all.

Interviewer: Open?

Doreen: Open.

Interviewer: Open V neck?

Doreen: Right.

Interviewer: Collar?

Doreen: Yeah.

Interviewer: Short sleeves?

Doreen: Yes.

Interviewer: Some of the golf shirts are knit wo that they are tight about the biceps.

Doreen: That's it.

Interviewer: The same?

Doreen: Yeah.

Interviewer: Now, his physical characteristics, weight, and build.

Doreen: Weight, I say 160 lbs., build, he was broad chested, big arms, not really big arms, fairly big, you know, I mean like he might have worked them out... (unintelligible) - but to me I think he is like 10 lbs. overweight ..

Interviewer: Big chest?

Doreen: Yes.

Interviewer: He is muscular in this area also?

Doreen: Yes.

Interviewer: Underneath the armpits?

Doreen: Yes.

Interviewer: Did he have a belly?

Doreen: Not really.

Interviewer: You just suppose he was 10 lbs. overweight but nothing physical, nothing visible like a gut?

Doreen: No, nothing like that.

Interviewer: Now about his eyes ..

Doreen: His eyes are like crystal, watery, almost piercing, you could see them, like I thought when he was looking at me that I had no clothes on, you know, more of a perverted way, but like I described it before, like he was just staring at us, like when my girlfriend and I turned our back on him hoping that he would go away and he wouldn't.

Interviewer: Did you pick up the color in his eyes?

Doreen: They are light, either light blue or gray, I couldn't ...

Interviewer: You know, they weren't dark, they wouldn't be brown?

Doreen: No, I'm positive they were not brown.

Interviewer: How about his nose?

Doreen: Nothing out of the ordinary, it looked gook in his face, it wasn't big or

Interviewer: Did you get any impression when you were looking at him wither like an ethnic impression; some people when you look at them you can say they are Italian, other look at and say they are Jewish, other look at and say they are Irish. Did you get any impression like that?

Doreen: Well, I thought more of a Swedish, because of the bold hair and his fair complexion, but I rarely did think about ethnic, you know ...

Interviewer: I realize that but you know sometimes an impression is made when you -- like if I were talking with somebody I could almost say you know I bet you are of Italian extraction.

Doreen: I would say he is Swedish or something of an Scandinavian ..

Interviewer: Was he tanned?

Doreen: No.

Interviewer: No tan at all.

Doreen: No.

Interviewer: Maybe he wasn't an outdoor type person.

Doreen: Definitely, he said he worked during the day downtown.

Interviewer: Did he say where he worked downtown?

Doreen: In the 50's - in the 60-s (telephone ringing in background-- unintelligible)

Interviewer: In Manhattan?

Doreen: Yeah.

Interviewer: OK. You mentioned something before that while you were talking with your girlfriend, he seemed to be aware of everything that was going on ..

Doreen: Yes.

Interviewer: Tell me again about it.

Doreen: Well, like I said, the bar was not crowded so that maybe 50 people were there and he stood with his back to the wall which was like 5 ft. behind us where there are mirrors and he did look over our shoulders into the mirror, not around, you know, like into the mirror ..

Interviewer: Shifting his glance ..

Doreen: Yes, he was constantly looking around but he wasn't looking around, he was staring ..

Interviewer: Now, we went through this before, I just want to make sure about his shirt and pants; was his shirt tucked into his pants, obviously he could not have had anything concealed just as a police officer wears gun?

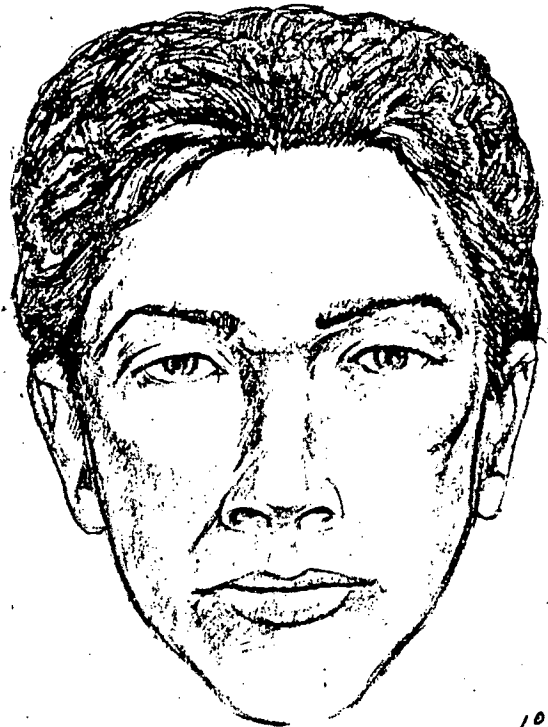

He further related that this subject did in fact drive a yellow VW and on numerous occasions while he was employed at this location this subject named James had stated to him after the arrest of Berkowitz that he in fact knew Berkowitz, had spoken to him in the elevator on several occasions at his home address 35 Pine St., and he used to call him Berky.

He further related that this subject also told him that his mother lived at that location and this was the reason that on several occasions he spoke to Berkowitz.

John Weiland felt that during the course of the time that he knew him he was a very jumpy person, did erratic things, and on one occasion he brought a long butcher knife to place of employment and stated to him that people were after him and it was going to be either them or him.

The undersigned then asked him again if he had any pertinent information regarding the David Berkowitz case or his actions and the reason for him writing this type of letter, whereupon he stated he knew nothing of the actions that David Berkowitz had taken or the shootings, only to the fact that he rode in his car and had lunch with him. Further, that the reason that he wrote this letter was that he was annoyed with the Parking Violations he had received near his house on Mulberry Street and also, he stated that sometimes, while he is taking a cold shower and the hot water hits him, he gets amnesia and he gets very upset regarding these parking tickets and starts writing letters pertaining to nothing.

He further related that he has had a problem of this sort since childhood and also, that he had had this problem while in the Armed Forces in 1958 to 1961 where he was released with an Honorable Discharge and also, he re-enlisted in 1965 to 1967, where he was released with a Dishonorable Discharge for not obeying any orders.

"Man With a Mustache"

Sources in the office of Brooklyn District Attorney Eugene Told, which filed the first of several indictments expected against Berkowitz, confirmed reports that police are seeking a man possibly involved in the case.

That suspect was described by sources as a "man with a mustache who was allegedly watching Son of Sam as he shot Judy Placido and Sal Lupo," as they sat in a parked car near the Elephas disco in Queens June 26.

At that time, witnesses said they saw the man leaving the scene in the same direction taken by Son of Sam. Detectives added that there were several other reports near locations of other shootings that indicated there were two men leaving those areas by car. However, most of those are considered coincidences, not firm information, they said.

"Something would have slipped out," one investigator said. "We feel that this was the work of a loner."

Yet, authorities are hard-pressed to explain how Berkowitz, in his block-printed letter to News columnist Jimmy Breslin, could be so poetic and seemingly in complete command of the English language. For his earlier letters to friends, written in script, contain numerous spelling and grammatical errors.

Stacy's Parents Plan \$10M Suit

Charging that Yonkers police ignored repeated complaints that should have led to the arrest of David Berkowitz before the confessed Son of Sam could murder their daughter Stacy, Jerry and Neysa Moskowitz intend to sue Yonkers for \$10 million, it was announced yesterday.

The Moskowitz' attorney, Spencer Lader, said notification of claim to the city of Yonkers was a formality and did not rule out that other parties would be named in the civil suit.

Stacy Moskowitz, 20, was fatally shot by the .44-caliber killer on July 31 as she sat in a parked car with Robert Violante, who was blinded by the killer's bullets. His parents have filed suit against Berkowitz, also for \$10 million.
