On the above date, the undersigned officers contacted A.D.A. Carl Falcone in the White Plains Office, who is assigned and handling all matters pertaining to the David Berkowitz's case.

The undersigned officers requested from him that if it be possible to obtain a subpoena which would entitle them to obtain the X-rays taken of Sam Carr's dog Harvey, in regards to an attempt to ascertain what size caliber bullet the animal was shot with.

Mr. Falcone related that at this time his office did not wish issue any subpoenas pertaining to the David Berkowitz's case due to the fact if it was necessary to obtain a subpoena for any records, it would have to be done before the Westchester County Grand Jury, and thereafter a case would have to be submitted to them for an indictment of said subject.

He further related that his office at this time do not want to push any issues regarding David Berkowitz, but would let the entire matter rest in the hands of the New York City Police and all charges be pursued by them.

Capt. Jones appraised of this decision made by the Westchester County District Attorney's Office.
