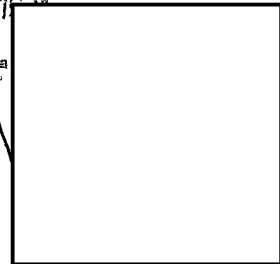

Gajdusek indicated he has traveled to the USSR frequently since the 1950's doing research in virology. He stated that all of his research is open and that none of it is classified. For this reason, subject refuses to be briefed or debriefed concerning his travels to the USSR. To emphasize this point, subject recently resisted the establishment of a laboratory at Ft. Detrick, Maryland, because of stipulations that all visiting scientists would have to be cleared.

Subject recently spent two and one half months in Siberia gathering research and stated that he has a good working relationship with the Soviets as well as scientists all over the world. Visiting Soviet scientists have had occasion to stay at Gajdusek's residence while working in the U. S.

In view of the above, WFO considers this preliminary inquiry terminated as of this date and this case is being closed.

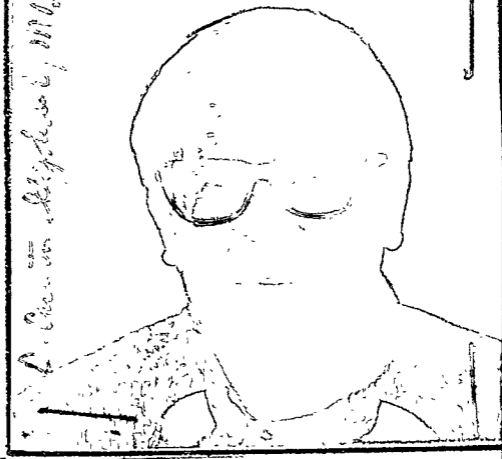

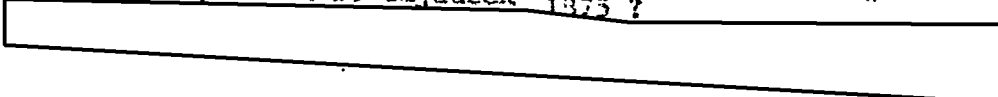

I travel almost continually and cannot reconstruct my itineraries of past travels. I do not keep records of such travel, for every year since 1955, and even before that, I have visited sites of medical research studies in New Guinea--often twice or three times a year--and have taken various routes there and back to the States, often around the world. In 1972 one of my many foreign trips therefore was as Chief Scientist on the U.S. Research Vessel Alpha Helix on an expedition to the South Pacific, a program of which is enclosed. In 1973 I was in Europe four times, travelling in many of the countries. I have been to the Soviet Union many times, representing the U.S. on official orders from the National Institutes of Health. All of my travel has been and is in connection with my professional work on geographic and ethnographic studies in pediatrics, infectious disease, and genetics.



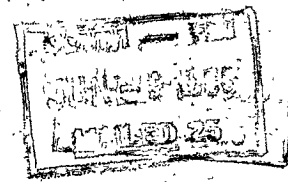



[redacted] stated that Medical School records reflected that the employee entered on March 8, 1943, and was awarded an M.D. Degree on March 23, 1946. According to the records, he was a graduate of the University of Rochester, Rochester, New York, class of 1943. [redacted] reviewed the employee's personal file maintained at the Medical School and stated that all information appearing therein was entirely favorable to the employee and that no information appeared which would reflect adversely on his moral character, associates or loyalty. [redacted] stated that he did not know the employee personally and that the employee's former faculty adviser is now deceased. He could not suggest anyone presently on the faculty who might recall the employee. According to [redacted] no information appears in the employee's file indicating where he resided as a medical student.

On June 17, 1958, Dr. LOUIS DIAMOND, Associate Professor of Pediatrics and Staff Member, Children's Hospital, Boston, Massachusetts, stated that he taught the employee at Harvard Medical School and also knew the employee at the Children's Hospital, where he worked in exchange for room and board while an undergraduate at the Medical School and also worked following his graduation from Medical School for a period of about two years. Dr. DIAMOND further stated that the employee is one of the very few true geniuses that he has ever encountered and that his interest in the employee was so great because of this that he also has maintained a social contact with the employee. Dr. DIAMOND stated that the employee is the type of individual who can do

anything that he sets his mind to and do it brilliantly. He stated that he would have no hesitation whatsoever in recommending the employee for a position of trust with the Government on the basis of moral character, associates and loyalty as known to him.

On June 17, 1958, [redacted]

[redacted] Children's Hospital, stated that for all practical purposes, the Children's Hospital and the Children's Medical Center are the same, as they are served and administered by the same personnel. She stated that records available in her office reflect that the employee worked as a Research Fellow in Medicine from November 1, 1949 to June 30, 1950. He was re-appointed on July 1, 1950, and served in the same capacity to July 31, 1951. [redacted] stated that she did not recall the employee but that she could state that no information is contained in his personnel file which would reflect adversely on his moral character, associates or loyalty. According to [redacted] the hospital records fail to reflect where the employee resided during this period of employment.

[redacted] Children's Hospital, checked the personnel records maintained by her office and stated that she had no record of any employment by the employee other than that previously furnished by [redacted]. She indicated that oftentimes deserving medical students do work at the hospital during odd hour shifts in return for room and board. She stated that while her records do not reflect this in the case of the employee, in all probability, he was so employed.

Children's Hospital Laboratory, stated that she knew the employee while he served as a Research Assistant about 1951 and that further, he returned for several weeks in 1952 while a member of the United States Army Medical Corps and performed some

research in the Laboratory in connection with an Army assignment. She stated that while she never knew the employee socially, he was a brilliant individual and impressed her favorably. She stated that she could recall nothing concerning him which would reflect adversely on his moral character, associates or loyalty.

On June 19, 1958, [redacted] Children's Hospital Laboratory, stated that he worked in the same room as the employee at the Children's Hospital Laboratory for approximately a year during 1950 and 1951. He stated that since that time he and his wife have maintained a social relationship with the employee. He stated that the employee is an extremely brilliant individual ~~but~~ that, in his opinion, he is stable and qualified for a position of trust with the Government on the basis of moral character, associates and loyalty.

[redacted] further indicated as a matter of interest that the employee's hobby is the study of the culture and habits of primitive people and other racial groups and that to further this hobby he does a great deal of traveling and also subscribes to literature which would be descriptive of such peoples and racial groups.

On June 24, 1958, [redacted] [redacted] Harvard Medical School, stated that he was [redacted] while the employee worked in the Children's Hospital Laboratory and that he also knew the employee as a medical student while working at the Children's Hospital. He stated that in order to properly evaluate the employee as a security risk, he felt that he should reveal that, in his opinion, the employee was at times careless, showed a streak of immaturity and lacked convention. He stated it should be said that the employee is a genius and that perhaps the aforementioned characteristics are inherent in the character of such a person. He explained that while employed by the Laboratory, the employee would put tremendous effort into his field of interest and accomplish a great deal, but might ruin parts of his experiment by leaving some of the material worked on out of refrigeration through carelessness. With regard to lack of convention, [redacted] stated that while in the Army, the employee once appeared at a reception for his Commanding Officer in full uniform, with the exception that he was wearing

a red necktie. He further indicated that on another formal occasion the employee appeared wearing a leather jacket, a pair of slacks and with an arm full of books. Regarding the employee's immaturity, [redacted] stated that the employee has interests other than medicine, mentioning that he apparently has as much interest in the study of primitive cultures and other racial groups in various countries as he does in medicine. He stated that, in his opinion, the employee has much to offer in the field of medicine, and he feels that the fact that the employee has not settled down is a decided exhibition of immaturity.

[redacted] indicated that other than the foregoing, he has never noted anything concerning the employee which would cause him to question him as a security risk. He further indicated that nothing had ever come to his attention concerning the employee which would reflect adversely on his moral character, associates or loyalty.

On June 23, 1958, [redacted] supra, was contacted and stated that while she had a vague recollection of the employee, she did not feel that she recalled him well enough to comment concerning his qualifications for Government employment. These issues were disposed of by the Bureau of Customs.

The "Leader" is a Russian political propoganda publication.

The employee, on his Security Investigation Form, reflects residence at 114 Palmer Road, Yonkers, New York, from 1938 to date.

The employee's period of affiliation with the Public Health Service will cover the period from April 21, 1958, to April 20, 1959. No information appears in the employee's personnel file, Public Health Service, which would reflect unfavorably on his character, reputation or loyalty to the United States Government.

[redacted], National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, Maryland, advised on June 24, 1958, that he has been acquainted with the employee from approximately 1951 or 1952 to date. He stated that he became acquainted with Doctor (Dr.) GAJDUSEK at Walter Reed Army Hospital and that Dr. GAJDUSEK was working [redacted] [redacted] during the early years of his association. He stated that he has continued his association and contacts with Dr. GAJDUSEK to the present time.
