By letter dated March 11, 2022, you have requested copies of certain documents pursuant to the Maryland Public Information Act (hereinafter, "PIA"), Md. Ann. Code, State Govt. Art., GP § 4-101 through § 4-601 et seq.

- Investigation & arrest records relating to Daniel Gajdusek, arrested for Child Abuse and Perverted Sexual Practice

You will find the documents requested enclosed. However, sociological information has been redacted. This is information that "identifies an individual including an individual's address, driver's license number or any other identification number, medical or disability information, name, photograph or computer generated image, Social Security number, or telephone number."


Such sociological information may be redacted in accordance with GP § 4-330 sociological information – if the official custodian has adopted rules or regulation that define sociological information for purposes of this subsection, a custodian shall deny inspection of the part of a public record that contains sociological information, in accordance with the rules or regulations.

Juvenile information has also been redacted, this is due to SG §7-303 of the Education Article, in which a police record concerning a child is confidential. Its contents may not be divulged, by subpoena or otherwise, except by order of the court upon good cause shown.

Pursuant to GP § 4-361, you are entitled to an administrative review of a decision to deny access. If requested, such review will be conducted in accordance with GP § 4-361(b) and the hearing regulations of the agency published at COMAR 00.00.01. You may also seek judicial review under GP § 4-362



During November 1995, a criminal investigation was initiated into the activities of Daniel Carleton Gajdusek, DOB 09-09-23, specifically regarding his relationship with minor children he has brought into the United States from Micronesia and New Guinea. Gajdusek currently resides at [REDACTED] Frederick County, Maryland, and is employed as a scientist for the National Institutes of Health, with offices in Bethesda and Frederick, Maryland.

Investigation has revealed that Gajdusek travels extensively to foreign countries and has spent much of his time conducting research in the South Pacific islands. While in this region, Gajdusek meets and subsequently arranges to bring minor children to the United States to live with him, presumably so that he can provide them with an education. At the time of this investigation, Gajdusek had brought approximately 56 children to live with him, with four children currently living with him.

In August 1989, Gajdusek was investigated by the Montgomery County (MD) Police Pedophile Section for allegations of child sexual abuse. Information was received regarding two adults who had been victimized as children by Gajdusek in the 1960's. During that investigation, it was learned that Gajdusek had been importing a large number of children, mostly boys, from Micronesia and New Guinea to live with him. This investigation was suspended when no current victims could be identified.

During February 1996, affiant received information indicating that Gajdusek possibly had sexually fondled two boys from his household. One was identified as [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] currently a college student and a dependant of Gajdusek's. Further investigation revealed that [REDACTED] entered the United States from Micronesia on 08-13-87 at the age of fourteen.

On 02-20-96, [REDACTED] was interviewed by the affiant and made the following disclosure: When he was approximately 15 years old, Gajdusek brought him to the United States from Micronesia to live with him and receive an education. [REDACTED] father approved of the arrangement. At that time, Gajdusek lived at [REDACTED] Frederick County, Maryland and had other children living in the residence as well. Shortly after arriving there, Gajdusek began sexually molesting [REDACTED] which consisted of Gajdusek fondling his penis and performing fellatio on him. These acts occurred numerous times at the residence, usually in [REDACTED] bedroom

or in the shower, with Gajdusek always initiating this activity. [REDACTED] would resist, but was overpowered due to Gajdusek's size. After approximately a year, Gajdusek moved to [REDACTED] Frederick County, Maryland, taking [REDACTED] with him, where the sexual abuse continued, still consisting of Gajdusek fondling him and performing fellatio on him. This activity went on until approximately two years ago, with the last incident occurring in the state of New York.

On 03-15-96, [REDACTED] had a telephone conversation with Gajdusek concerning the sexual abuse. In that conversation, Gajdusek admitted to sexually abusing [REDACTED] and apologized to him. Gajdusek admitted to having sex with other minors, including while in foreign countries. [REDACTED] asked him if he knew what a pedophile is, and Gajdusek answered, "I am one". Gajdusek pleaded with [REDACTED] not to report the sexual abuse to anyone and said that if he did, he (Gajdusek) would have to close down his house and leave the country. Gajdusek asked [REDACTED] to lie to the authorities if questioned about the sexual abuse. Immediately after this telephone conversation, Gajdusek was scheduled to leave the country for a work related conference.

Based on the aforementioned facts, your affiant believes that probable cause exists for the issuance of an arrest warrant charging DANIEL CARLETON GAJDUSEK, DOB [REDACTED] with the following offenses:

Godec stated that he was concerned about the construction in the area of Himes Avenue and Butterfly Lane. A large white mansion used to be on the hill and burned down years ago. The fire ruled as arson and was determined that juveniles were involved in the incident. Godec said he has worked with the Frederick County States Attorney's Office, and federal agents with Internal Revenue Service and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He said that he helped with the prosecution of Dr. Daniel Carleton Gajdusek. He said he has been involved in the investigation of Gajdusek for the past three years. Godec stated that he has worked with FBI agent Patty Freante and IRS agent Anthony Brooks.

Godec said that he believed Gajdusek was living in the mansion from the year 1979 till some year in the 1990's. He said that Gajdusek rented the home and lived their with a dozen or so juveniles.

Godec was concerned that in the federal investigation not all of the "missing" juveniles that had come into contact with Gajdusek had been located. Godec showed great concern in believing that the unaccounted victims may have been buried near the mansion or burned in the fire that destroyed the mansion. Godec was very concerned and was wondering about the capability of using police canines to try to locate the buried victims. Godec said that he also works at NIH where Gajdusek was once employed. He further stated that he knew Gajdusek when he worked at a lab on Fort Detrick.

Detective Bowerman inquired on the current condition on where the mansion was located. The Cavalier Construction Company has been building new houses and digging foundations where the mansion once stood. Detective Bowerman contacted the Vice President and partner of Cavalier Construction, Donald Edward Owens. Mr. Owens advised that during the construction process no unusual indents had occurred. He relayed to Detective Bowerman that if any unusual bones or evidence of bodies was unearthed the police authorities would have been immediately contacted.

Detective Bowerman attempted to contact FBI agent Freante but was advised she was on maternity leave. Detective Bowerman contacted Frederick County States Attorney Scott Rolle. Rolle was quite familiar with Godec and advised that Godec had come to his office with the same information about a year ago. Rolle advised that Godec seemed at times off the wall and not many of his investigative tips had panned out. He said that Godec's claims were presented previously and had been investigated with no results. The investigation of Gajdusek was closed with his arrest and conviction.

Detective Bowerman spoke with Ted Meminger of the State Fire Marshals Office. He stated that the fire in question was started by juveniles and the fire was ruled arson. At the time of the fire investigation it was determined that no one lived in the mansion. The juveniles involved in the incident had been identified.

Detective Bowerman continued to receive voice mail messages from Godec listing resources that he has obtained over the internet.

10-16-97 1040 hours


Detective Bowerman went to the area of Himes Avenue and the construction sites near the Himes Avenue park. Detective Bowerman spoke with several workers in the area. They pointed out the remains of the pool that was once located next to the large mansion. They said the mansion actually stood in the area that is now paved and has been changed into a small community park. During this construction of the park the entire area had been excavated and built upon.

10-16-97 1100 hours

Detective Bowerman met with Godec at the Himes Avenue park. Detective Bowerman showed Godec the remains of the pool in the construction area. Godec realized that if any bodies had been buried near the mansion they would have surely been discovered by the construction crews. Detective Bowerman advised Godec that all investigative leads had been exhausted and if he had any new information for the Sheriff's Office to follow up to come forward with that information.
