Spoke with former wife of John Carr - 10-20-70.

Dorothy Skipper, now married to James, Route 1  
Box QV -1-40 Kountze, Texas. (713) 246-4417. She and  
Skipper work at CL Sherman and Son Lumber (713) 861-7767.

Says, she has no Carr writings, he did not write;  
maybe signed checks and greeting cards, but no letters.

Says, except the Carr Family, he never made or  
received phone calls while visiting his daughter in  
present address.

Says, she received no effects of John Carr from  
Minot.

Says, John often hitch-hiked down for visits.  
Only once or twice drove down. Once in a dark green  
van, believes it was in 76 or 77.

Once he drove his sister's Wheat, car in old red  
Plymouth 1970 or so model. } (See)

Says, John was not an illustrator. That it was  
Michael who was the photographer and illustrator.

Says, John always visited daughter around Christman  
without fail. Never had friends she ever saw in Baumont,  
Texas.

Says, John was visiting her and daughter in August,  
1977, when David Berkowitz was arrested. She remembers  
because he watched it on TV and became upset when he saw  
parent's house on TV screen. He tried to call them, searched  
them, but there were so many media and others at house he  
could talk with them.
